Camper FAQs

Question: Are your camps overnight?

Answer: Yes, our camps are overnight camps

Question: Where are you located?

Answer: We are located at scenic Lake Brownwood Texas.

Question: What should my child bring to camp

Question: Will my camper need money at camp?

Question: Will my camper room with my county?

Answer: Campers will only be roomed with their county for our county camps. We make a conscious effort to group campers by appropriate age within a year age gap up or down.

Question: My camper wants to room with a friend, how do I make this happen?

Answer: We understand that your camper wants to bring friends and room with them during camp. For the 2023-2024 camp season we will not be accepting roommate requests. This is not to deter campers from bringing friends, but to encourage the making of **NEW** friends at camp.

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Question: My first-year camper and their sibling is about to age out of camping eligibility. Can my 8yr old room with my 13yr. old?

Answer: No. Siblings that fall into the one-to-two-year age range will be accommodated at parent request. To keep an appropriate age range in the dorms anything outside of the one-to-two-year age range will be grouped within their appropriate age range. Special circumstances will be considered by Program Director.

Question: My camper is a picky eater/ has several food allergies. Will they have food available that they can eat?
